SHOW REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS FOR COMPETITION ENTRANTS/EXHIBITORS

1. All exhibitors must have acquired gate tickets to be entitled entry to the Show.
2. Exhibitors must adhere to Work Health and Safety Regulations, or risk being asked to leave the grounds.
3. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused to or by any exhibit and will not be responsible for any loss or non-delivery of exhibit.

4. The Committee shall have the right to remove from the Showgrounds, at any time, any exhibit and/or any person connected with it, which, in the opinion of the Committee, is objectional or may be detrimental to the Committee's interest and no person so removed shall have any right of action or claim for damages against the Committee or Committee members in respect of any action taken by the Committee under these regulations.
5. **Competition entries close** on Friday 9 May unless stated otherwise in specific sections.
6. **Entries are made online** - www.fredspassruralshow.org.au Registration is via the ShowDay Online portal. Follow the online links through to the shopping cart. Membership fees may also be paid once you have entered your online entries and before you check-out.
7. **A paper copy of this Schedule** may be collected from the Show Office (phone for opening hours) or the Nelson, Goyder, Daly, Brennan and Spillett Electoral Offices, along with paper entry forms for those who do not have computer access. The entry form can also be downloaded from our website.
8. Completed paper entry forms with cash or cheque payment can be hand delivered to the Show Office (phone for opening hours) or the Nelson, Goyder, Daly, Brennan and Spillett Electoral Offices, up to Friday 9 May.
9. One exhibitor per paper entry form only.
10. **Entry Fees** (unless stated otherwise):
 - Non-Members \$2.40
 - Members, Disability/Carer/Aged Pensioners, Senior Card Holders, Juniors (under 18 years) \$1.20
11. No late entries will be accepted.
12. The Chief Steward may place in the correct class exhibits considered to be entered in an incorrect class.
13. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decisions of the judges appointed by the Show Committee as final.
14. No exhibitors shall be permitted to be in attendance while the judging of exhibits is in progress unless by special request of the stewards.
15. **Prize money and prizes will be distributed** from the Competitions Office during the Show on:
 - Saturday from 3 pm to 5 pm
 - Sunday from 10 am to 11.30 am; 1 pm to 3 pm.
16. **Prize Money** (unless stated otherwise) Prize money does not include GST.
 - Adults 1st \$10, 2nd \$6, 3rd \$4
 - Juniors 1st \$8, 2nd \$4, 3rd \$2
17. No exhibit can be removed from the showgrounds before 4 pm on Sunday 25 May.
18. Exhibit pick-up times are Sunday 25th 4 pm – 6 pm, and Monday 26th 10 am – 5 pm.
19. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to arrange a time for collection of exhibits and/or prize money at another time if these times are not suitable.
20. Prize monies/exhibits unclaimed by 13 June will be forfeited.

WHERE TO DELIVER YOUR EXHIBITS

Please check the show map on our website before you deliver your exhibit, so as to familiarise yourself with the location of the pavilion you need to go to. The new show location is on the western side of the Freds Pass Reserve, around Lakeview Hall. Look out for signage to help you find your way and allow time to get lost!

New for 2025 – the Creative Pavilion is now in Lakeview Hall, and the Cookery Pavilion is on the grass beside the Hall. All other pavilions are where they were last year.

VEHICLES: Please note you are entering a busy construction zone when you drop off your exhibits and there will be other vehicles and machinery in the area. If you need to bring your exhibits in by vehicle, you can do so, however you must remove your vehicle from the show grounds immediately after dropping off. Where you have parked might be where a site needs to bump in! If you need to stay for a longer period of time, you can park your vehicle across the road near the Sand Arena on the corner of Central Corridor and Melville Way and return to the grounds on foot.



NT Show Council Schools Awards

The NT Show Council is sponsoring 4 awards for schools entering competitions at the Freds Pass Rural Show. The aims of this sponsorship are to encourage school participation in NT agricultural shows, to raise awareness of NT show competitions, to increase school/student show participation and to grow the next generation's involvement in NT shows.

The following awards are offered to the school in each category which submits the most entries in this year's Freds Pass Rural Show.

Early Learning/Childcare Centre/Preschool	\$400
Primary School	\$700
Middle School	\$700
Secondary School	\$700

Entries may be placed by any of the school admin, teachers, or support staff, and can be entered in separate registrations and over varying dates – as long as the school's name is written in the "Company" box when registering. Student's names must be inserted as the "Entrant" when their individual schoolwork is entered, and school class/grade titles must be inserted for "Entrant" for group projects.

Keep the Exhibitor's card side yourself (to claim prize money and retrieve your exhibit after the show) and attach the Exhibit Card side to the **front of your exhibit** when you bring it in to the pavilion at the scheduled time. For those without email addresses, the Exhibit Cards will be supplied by the Show.

Exhibit Cards are only emailed to entrants in Cookery, Horticulture, Market Garden, Art, Photography and Craft.

Please read the instructions in each class carefully, in particular size and presentation requirements.

- Dates for exhibits to be delivered for judging can be found in each section below. Both Adult and Junior exhibits are received on the same day.
- Read carefully the requirements for hanging or presenting the exhibit. Exhibits not complying will not be accepted.
- If a class has size restrictions, any over-sized exhibit will not be accepted.
- Exhibits and prize cards can be removed between 4pm and 6 pm on Sunday 25 May. The Creative, Cookery and Horticulture Pavilions will be open from 10 am - 5 pm on Monday 26 May for collection of exhibits and prize money. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to arrange a time for collection of exhibits and/or prize money at another time if these times are not suitable. Exhibits not removed by 13 June will be disposed of by the committee.

Patchwork, Quilting & Applique

- Definition of a quilt for exhibition at Freds Pass Rural Show: A quilt must consist of 3 layers – usually a patchwork or appliqued top or plain or embellished fabric, a layer of batting and a backing fabric; all three layers to be held together with hand or machine stitching
- All quilts must have a 10 cm hanging sleeve securely attached to the whole length of the top edge at the back. If temporary, it must be tacked. Pinned or safety pinned sleeves will not be accepted.

INFORMATION FOR ALL LIVESTOCK CLASSES

- All animals must be healthy and free from disease.
- Any animal that is, in the opinion of the Livestock Coordinator/Steward not healthy or is diseased, is to be removed immediately from the showgrounds.
- **Livestock Movement Biosecurity Requirements** - Persons bringing any of the following animals to the Freds Pass Rural Show, either for competition, demonstration or display, must meet the requirements of the Livestock Act and Livestock Regulations:

 - there are no restrictions on moving poultry or pigeons.
- All cattle, buffalo, goats, deer and sheep entering the showgrounds must be identified with a NLIS device and must be accompanied by a complete waybill which includes the property identification (PIC) of the property of origin.
- Pigs must have a completed NT Waybill.
- The Steward will issue waybills for these animals leaving the showgrounds.
- The Freds Pass Rural Show will complete the upload of movement records to the NLIS Database.
- Livestock returning interstate or below the tick line must have a clean Inspection and supervised treatment.

Poultry Young Judges Championship

This is an exciting opportunity for young people to learn about poultry judging and experience competing in a competition. Entering the Poultry Young Judges Championship is free but there are limited entries – only 5 per age group (7-11 years, 12-17 years and 18-25 years).

Competitors must have at least one bird entered in the pure-bred classes in the 2025 Freds Pass Rural Show (i.e. not Backyard Poultry).

The poultry judge at the 2025 Freds Pass Rural Show, Kerin Politch (Qld) will be the Competition Judge for the Poultry Young Judges Championship. He will run a workshop at the show in the morning on Sunday 25 May for all those competing, to prepare them for the competition on Sunday afternoon. Other interested people can also attend this workshop.

There are two elements to the competition:

1. Judging a group of four birds and placing them from 1st to 4th
2. Explaining to the judge why you have placed them in this order – what are the good points that reflect the standard for that breed; what features are defects.

Instructions:

1. Enter your own bird/s in a pure-bred class at Freds Pass Rural Show.
2. Enter as a contestant in the Young Judges Championship in your age group.
3. Nominate which class you wish to judge when it's time for the competition (probably your own breed e.g. Silkie cockerel, Plymouth Rock pullet).
4. Competitors will be allowed 8 minutes to judge four birds in the class they've nominated. Judging is based on how each competitor catches, examines and returns the bird to the pen, as well as their placings.
5. Competitors will be allowed 2 minutes to explain their placings to the judge. Competitors will be judged on accuracy of their observations; ability to compare birds; speaking ability; and presentation.

Darwin & Rural Poultry Club will run a pre-show preparation workshop for all entrants to have an opportunity to practice judging and speaking. It is not compulsory.
